ASHRAE Submits Response to Treasury Department on Changes to 179D Tax Credit

The U.S. Department of Treasury and Internal Revenue Service called on the public to provide feedback on how to apply the \$270 million in tax incentive funding received from the Inflation Reduction Act. The 179D Commercial Buildings Energy-Efficiency Tax Deduction incentivizes building owners and designers to opt for building designs at least 25 percent more energy efficient than a reference building from ASHRAE Standard 90.1. Presently, the tax deduction relies on ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2007 because Treasury has not affirmed the more recent version, ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2019.



ASHRAE's response to the Treasury Department declared that to meaningfully contribute to meeting the Administration's

goal of achieving a 50-52 percent reduction from 2005 greenhouse gas emission levels by 2030, and a net zero emissions economy by 2050, the Department of the Treasury should align with the U.S. Department of Energy and affirm the most recent version of the standard, ASHRAE Standard 90.1-2019, as the reference building standard. If affirmed, ASHRAE 90.1-2019 would become the reference building standard four years from the date of affirmation.

<u>David Rickelton - Southern Piedmont Chapter Presidential</u>

In last month's article, I focused on the 70th birthday of the Southern Piedmont Chapter and in that article, I listed the those who have served as past presidents of our great chapter.

One name that you may have scanned past was that of <u>David Rickelton</u>. Take a peek back at that article and you

will find that Mr. Rickelton served as the chapter president in the 1962-1963 ASHRAE year. One less than a decade later (1971-1973) he would serve society as ASHRAE vice president and the next year he would be elected to the office of ASHRAE president. Thus far he is the only member of the Southern Piedmont Chapter to achieve that high honor.

Region IV has had four society presidents in past years. Here is a list:

2020-2021 – Chuck Gulledge (North Piedmont)

2014-2015 – Tom Phoenix (North Piedmont)


1987-1988 – Barney Burroughs (Atlanta)

1974-1975 – David Rickelton (Southern Piedmont)

Next year Region IV will once more be at the top with Ginger Scoggins (Triangle Chapter) slated for election to the office in June 2023.



Prior to his taking the office of ASHRAE president Mr. Rickelton was vice president of Aeronca, Inc. Environmental Control Group, in Charlotte. He served on numerous committees at society and authored articles on pressurized air systems, variable volume systems, system psychrometrics, and energy conservation. He lectured at more than 50 ASHRAE chapters. David Rickelton served ASHRAE at a time when America was experiencing the energy crisis of the early 1970's and was called upon by then US President Gerald Ford to assist in the formulation of the nation's energy policy.
